CTHGC ANNUAL CREATIVE PROJECT

Learners are invited to create a memorial or commemorative piece in recognition of South Africa's Apartheid past, and to share within it a message of hope for our future.

WHAT IS THE AIM OF THE PROJECT?

- To understand why we remember, and to be active participants in the process of remembering our own past.
- To learn about the Holocaust, how this history has been remembered and
- commemorated, and what relevance this has to memorialisation in South Africa.
- Through remembering, to work towards making "Never Again" a reality.

GUIDLINES FOR YOUR SUBMISSION

- Using Holocaust memorials and commemoration as your inspiration, think about how we can memorialise people, places or events in South Africa.
- Create a memorial or commemorative piece that remembers events/ people/ places in your community, suburb, city or country during the Apartheid era.

- Your creative project should have within it a positive message for our future.
- All entries must be accompanied by a rationale (approximately half to 1 page), explaining your creative process.
 Why have you chosen to memorialize this person, event or place? What is your concept? Who is the memorial or commemoration aimed at, and where/ how will they access it?

CHOOSE ONE CATEGORY FROM THE LIST BELOW:

Category A: 2D or 3D Artwork

Use any artistic medium (e.g. pencil, markers, crayons, ink, paint, mixed media, collage, paper, cardboard, clay, recycled materials, etc.) to create an illustration or 3D model of your memorial.

Category B: Creative Writing

Write an essay, poem, article or research piece on the topic of *Holocaust Memory* as a Lens for Remembrance in South Africa. Essays should not exceed 1000 words.

Category C: Spoken Word

Record a performance of a monologue, poem or song on the topic of *Holocaust Memory as a Lens for Remembrance in South Africa.* You can submit your entry as a video or audio file. Submissions should not be longer than five minutes.

Category D: Video or Digital Media

Design a web page or digital installation, or create a short film, on the topic of *Holocaust Memory as a Lens for Remembrance in South Africa*. Videos should not be longer than 5 minutes. Digital media must not be live.

HOW YOUR ENTRY WILL BE ASSESSED

- Responds to the topic *Holocaust Memory*as a Lens for Remembrance in South Africa
- Technical proficiency and creativity
- Originality of concept
- Overall impact
- Clear rationale

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR ENTRY:

- Art submissions must be photographed (2-5 photos per entry).
 Please include the dimensions of the artwork or 3D model.
- Written submissions must be sent in Word or PDF format.
- All submissions must be sent via
 WeTransfer to orli@holocaust.org.za
- Please name each file (Jpeg, Word, PDF, audio or visual file) with the your name, grade, and school.
- All submissions must be accompanied by the entry form (see pg 4)
- Please write your name on the entry form, and not on the submission itself. This is because we will be assessing all submissions anonymously.
- Your submission must be original, and plagiarism is not allowed.
